
- LR-1 .22 LONG RIFLE (HIGH VELOCITY). Bulk packed box of 500 rounds. Light blue plastic label with black printing. White, two-piece, full-cover box. No product code on the box. "VF-1" h/s on a brass case. Brass plated lead bullets. This box was first imported during 1983 and was discontinued during that year.
- LR-2 <u>.22 LONG RIFLE (STANDARD VELOCITY).</u> Same as LR-1 except for a call out on the box ends stating STANDARD VELOCITY. Plain lead bullets.

 - (b) White label (shown)
- LR-3 <u>.22 LONG RIFLE (HIGH VELOCITY).</u> Same as LR-l, except a 50 round box. First imported during 1984 and was discontinued about 1988. Variations noted:

- LR-4 <u>.22 LONG RIFLE (STANDARD VELOCITY).</u> Same as LR-3 except a standard velocity loading. Variations noted:
 - (a) "VF-1" headstamp Plain lead bullets.
 - (b) "VF-2" headstamp Plain lead bullets.
 - (c) "A-13" headstamp Plain lead bullets.
 - (d) "V-5" headstamp Plain lead bullets.
- LR-5 <u>.22 LONG RIFLE (HIGH VELOCITY-TARGET).</u> "TARGET GRADE" White and red box with black printing. One-piece box with end flaps. No product code on the box. "V-5" h/s on a brass case. Copper plated lead bullet with 3K,1S.
- LR-6 <u>.22 LONG RIFLE (STANDARD VELOCITY-TARGET).</u> "TARGET GRADE". Same as LR-5 except a standard velocity loading and a blue and white box. Plain lead bullets with 3K,lS.







