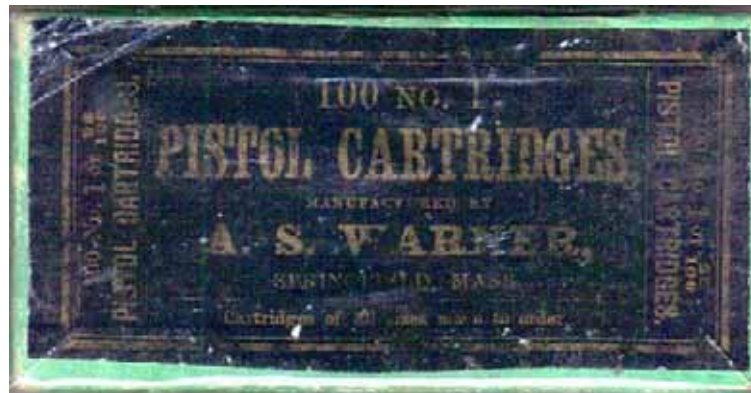

A.S. Warner, C. D. Leet & H. C. Lombard were in the ammo business prior to 1863, when a fire destroyed their manufacturing company. A.S. Warner is believed to be a relative of James Warner of Civil War carbine fame. After the fire Lombard took a military position, it is believed to be with the South. Leet went on to other ventures. It is believed that the .22 cases may have been manufactured by S&W. Possibly Warner was using S&W seconds.
